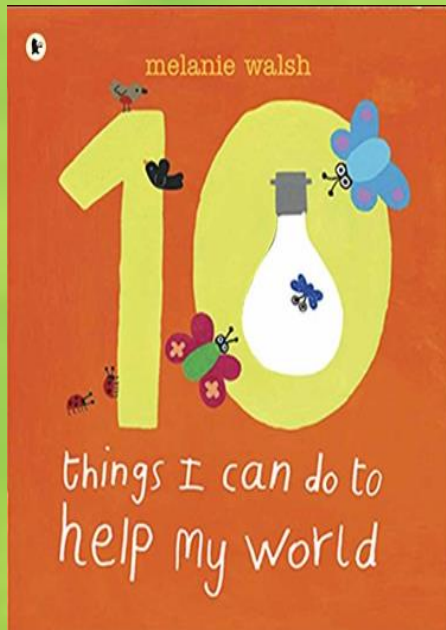

Maths Ideas

- Year 2 – play on TT Rockstars.

- Count in 1's to 100 forwards and backwards.
- Write your numbers in words, as far as you can go.
- Write the days of the week, in order and watch the spellings. Try the months of the year.
- Draw some circles, can you make them into clocks. Try showing the different times for when you get up, have lunch, tea and when you go to bed. Do you know the times? Be careful with the hands of the clock faces.
- Practise your number bonds to 10, 20, 50 and even 100.
- Can you draw the different coins you know? Which is the highest? Which is lowest?

- Write a book review. Think about the different elements – text, illustrations.

- Write some instructions on how to look after the environment. Remember how they should be set out.
- What changes could you make to change the world? Think about this and re-write the story using your 10 things you could do to change the world.
