



- Make paper aeroplanes, add detail such as windows using crayon/pens
- Create wall rubbings by holding paper against a wall and rubbing over the paper with wax crayon. Use different walls and look at the patterns.
- Create egg shell mosaic pictures using broken egg shell, glue and paint. Can you create a pattern or a picture?
- Create your own egg puzzle for your adult to put together again. Drawn Humpty and then cut him into pieces (not too small.) See if your grown up can solve your puzzle and put Humpty back together again
- Hard boiled eggs- use wooden or metal spoons and have an egg and spoon race outside

How did he feel when he couldn't sit on the wall anymore? How did he feel when he managed to create an aeroplane?
- If you made playdough last week or have some at home, create a Humpty Dumpty out of dough. What could you use for arms and legs? Don't forget to give him a face!
- Build walls using construction such as lego/duplo. Is your wall strong enough to support an object?

## MATHS IDEAS

Practice counting to 101 and back from 25

Practice ordering numbers by popping the balloons in order

<https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/hundredSq/index.html> Use the hundred square and click 'hide and reveal' at the right hand side. Hide a numbers on the number square by clicking on them and ask your child to identify which numbers is missing. Encourage them to look at the numbers before and after to figure it out. If this is too easy, hide a few numbers at once.

We can still order numbers when some are missing.  
 Make number cards to 10 using paper and pens. Take some number cards away and lay the others on the floor mixed up. Ask your child to put the remaining number cards in order. Make 10-20 or even higher numbers and repeat.

Tall and short. Using the correct language look for objects that are tall/short inside and outside. Can you find things that are taller/shorter than you?

Using Lego or other bricks create a short and tall towers. Can you find objects that are taller/shorter than your towers?

Collect a few objects from around the house, order them shortest to tallest. Make sure you use objects that can stand upright, e.g. dinosaur figures, cups, pencil pot, box.

Listen to the story, talk about the story

Draw a picture of Humpty Dumpty. You may want to add the wall, all the kings horses etc. Don't forget to add detail to your drawing. Add labels to your picture to tell us about it.

Adjectives are describing words. Choose a picture from the story and write some sentences about it using adjectives to make your sentences really interesting e.g. Humpty looks up at the grey sky and tiny birds.

Adult to read 'Magical times in nursery rhymes' by Brenda Williams. Do you recognise any of the nursery rhymes in this poem? How many do you know? Can you sing them? You might like to listen to some of them at <https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-songs-index/zhwdgwx>

Humpty Dumpty is afraid of heights but felt free as a bird once he faced his fear. What are you afraid of and why? Can you write a letter to Humpty and tell him about yourself and your fear?

Investigate which birds/animals lay eggs. Make a list.
