

The Wider Curriculum

- Can you use colour and shape to create a self-portrait in the style of Picasso?
- Create a poster of animals and colours which you feel represent your emotions? What does it feel like when you're happy? What about sad?
- Find out about the habitats of one of the creatures in the story.

 How are they adapted to it?
- Can you create a colour chart of colours similar to the ones that paint companies would make? Can you find inventive names for your colour chart?
- Use your knowledge of French to label things with their colours.
 How many different colours can you label in your house?
- How would you create the characters from Inside Out? Would you choose the same colours for each emotion? What other emotions would you represent? What colour would they be?
- Listen to a range of songs with colours in the titles. Can you
 describe how they make you feel?
- Find the most common colours of flowers in your garden / around your local area. Pick one of the flowers and research it - why do they have vivid colours?
- Put food dye in water and place fresh cut flowers in them (roses / carnations work well). What happens to the petals?
