



COVID-19: Outbreak Management Plan High View Primary Learning Centre ~ September 2021

1. Introduction

This plan is based on the contingency framework for managing local outbreaks of COVID-19 and the schools operational guidance from step 4, provided by the Department for Education (DfE). We will only implement some, or all, of the measures in this plan in response to recommendations provided by our local authority (LA), director of public health (DsPH), Public Health England (PHE) health protection team or the national government. It may be necessary to implement these measures in the following circumstances, for example:

- To help manage a COVID-19 outbreak within the school
- If COVID-19 infection rates in the community are extremely high, and other measures have failed to reduce transmission
- As part of a package of measures responding to a 'variant of concern' (VoC)

2. Seeking Public Health Advice

When one of the thresholds above is met, we will review the testing, hygiene and ventilation measures already in place. We will also seek public health advice from a director of public health or health protection team. Theresa Smith (Headteacher) will be responsible for seeking this advice, and will do so by telephoning the DfE helpline (0800 046 8687) or by contacting the Barnsley Local Public Health Team

3. Shielding

We will adhere to national guidance on the reintroduction of shielding, which would apply to those on the shielded patient list (SPL). We will speak to individuals required to shield about additional protective measures in school or arrangements for home working or learning.

4. Other measures

If recommended, we will limit:

- Residential educational visits
 Open days
- Transition or taster days

- Parents/Carers coming into school
- Live performances 3 If recommended, we will reintroduce:
- Bubbles, to reduce mixing between groups
- Face coverings in communal areas and classrooms for staff and visitors (unless exempt)

5. Attendance restrictions

Attendance restrictions will only be recommended as a last resort. If recommended, we will implement the measures in this section.

- 5.1 Eligibility to remain in school In the first instance, we will stay open for:
- Vulnerable pupils
- Children of critical workers
- Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils

If further restrictions are recommended, we will stay open for:

• Vulnerable pupils • Children of critical workers

5.2 Education and support for pupils at home

All other pupils will be required to stay at home and will receive remote education.

We will aim to deliver remote education that meets the same quality and quantity of education that pupils would receive in school, as outlined in our Remote Learning Policy – October 2020

The school will continue to provide meals or food parcels for pupils eligible for benefits-related free school meals while they are not attending school because of COVID-19 isolation guidelines. Food parcels will be ordered through Barnsley Catering Services and upon delivery (usually within 2 days). Parents/Carers will be asked to collect from school, if appropriate.

5.3 After School Clubs

We will limit access to after-school activities during term time to those that need it most.

We will communicate who will be eligible to attend once the restrictions are confirmed.

We will review our child protection policy to make sure it reflects the local restrictions and remains effective.

We will aim to have a trained DSL (Designated Safeguarding Lead) or deputy DSL on site wherever possible. If our DSL (or deputy) can't be on site, they can be contacted remotely through the school email <u>highviewadmin@ecmtrust.co.uk</u>.

On occasions where there is no DSL or deputy on site, a senior leader will take responsibility for co-ordinating safeguarding on site. See Appendix one for further detailed information for Parents/Carers and School Community.
